Join us for a “Fed Getaway” as we travel to Kansas City, MO. The National Archives will be displaying their two newest exhibits. Drawing on more than nine million pages of documents and court cases, *Divided Loyalties* examines the upheaval and uncertainty that characterized Missouri during the Civil War era. The exhibit goes beyond the stories of battles and military strategy and shows the conflict that permeated the state for the two decades that followed the Kansas Border Wars of the mid-1850s. It opens with a look at pre-Civil War Missouri and the role the institution of slavery played in the state’s culture and economy. It shows how slaves were treated as property that could be bought, sold, and distributed by probate courts. It also features the famous court case brought by Dred and Harriet Scott, two slaves seeking their freedom in St. Louis.

“*They’re Not Going to Get Me:*” Crime in the 1930’s: For some men and women who turned to a life of crime, it was high time with plenty of stolen loot, machine guns, getaway vehicles, and outlaw legends. This exhibit traces the story of the bank robbers and gangsters who became national icons in the 1930’s and the resulting development of J. Edgar Hoover’s FBI and the war on crime. See original records relating to notorious criminals, their gangs, and molls; including the Barker-Karpis Gang, John Dillinger, Machine Gun Kelly, Bonnie and Clyde, Pretty Boy Floyd, and Baby Face Nelson.

After lunch at Crown Center we take a guided tour of the Money Museum at Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City. Watch millions of dollars in currency be processed, lift a gold bar worth nearly \$400,000, see a 450 piece collection of coins minted under each U.S. President, on loan from the Harry S. Truman Library and much more! The Federal Reserve Bank of KC is home to one of the region’s largest automated cash vaults. See how the bank employees and the vault’s robots work together to move large containers of cash within a secure area. Step into the shoes of a bank examiner, try to spot a counterfeit bill and see what \$40 million in cash really looks like! Many interactive and fun exhibits await you!

You will go through security at the Federal Reserve Bank. You must present your government issued photo ID. When making a reservation, we need the exact name as it appears on your driver’s license or government issued ID per Federal Reserve Bank policy.
